WEAR A MASK on the stairs in Mt. Tabor – We have received multiple complaints via social media and our website regarding a lack of mask etiquette on the narrow stairs that traverse the dam face between Reservoir 5 and Reservoir 6. Please wear a mask while on these stairs, so everyone feels safe. Get EMERGENCY ALERTS – Sign up for the public alert system, so you know when an emergency is happening and what to do. The wildfires are not out yet. https://www.publicalerts.org/signup

Hawthorne reconfiguration by PBOT – PBOT proposes a reconfiguration of car lanes on Hawthorne which could result in significant changes to Hawthorne, including a reduction of lanes. This project proposes changes from 24th - 50th Avenues. No changes are proposed for 12th - 24th Avenues. This project also involves new curb ramps; construction will begin for those curb ramps next month and carry on until May 2021.
